





Key Vocabulary	Definition
Digestive system	Responsible for getting food into and out of the body.
Mouth	Where chewing takes place.
Teeth	Used for biting and breaking food into smaller pieces.
Tongue	Used for tasting, licking and swallowing.
Oesophagus	Links the mouth to the stomach.
Stomach	Where digestion of food occurs.
Small intestine	Where nutrients are absorbed into the blood.
Large intestine	Where water and vitamins are reabsorbed.
Food chain	Shows what eats what in a habitat.
Producer	An organism that takes energy from the sun and makes food, using water and carbon dioxide.
Consumer	An organism that uses other organisms for food.

The order that animals feed on other plants and animals is called a food chain.




Plants get their energy from sunlight using photosynthesis.




Nearly all food chains start with a green plant. These are called producers.
